**Course Announcement – NADRC.** The Office of the Army General Counsel, ADR Program Office (OGC-ADR), is accepting applications for the 2016 Negotiation and Appropriate Dispute Resolution Course (NADRC), to be held 2-6 May 2016, at the Air Force Judge Advocate General's School, Maxwell AFB, Montgomery, Alabama. The Army has been allocated up to 30 centrally-funded seats for this year's course. NADRC is a negotiation skills development and Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) awareness course for judge advocates and civilian attorneys in all facets of government legal practice, regardless of subject matter, specialty, or experience level. Utilizing a mix of guest speakers, lectures by subject-matter experts and immersive role-playing exercises, NADRC teaches students how to become more effective bilateral negotiators while secondarily introducing them to the spectrum of ADR processes involving a third-party neutral. The course exposes students to the interest-based negotiation model and other negotiation and ADR techniques. Exercises include multiple one-on-one and team negotiations in a variety of subject-matter contexts, and a mock mediation. Active Army, Army Reserve and Army National Guard JAGs and civilian attorneys are eligible.

There is no course cost for NADRC. Travel and per diem costs of Army attendees will be paid by Army OGC. All selectees **MUST** have access to the Defense Travel System (DTS) for OGC-funded travel. Additional information and instructions will be sent to selectees upon notification of selection.

Submit nominations (self-nominations are acceptable) by email to the undersigned POC no later **than 1700 hours EST, Friday, 26 February 2016**. Late submissions will not be considered. Include "NADRC Nomination" and the nominee's name on the Subject line. Provide in the body of the email the nominee's full name, rank or grade, duty station and component (i.e., active Army, Army Reserve, or Army National Guard), mailing address, telephone (commercial and DSN), duty email address, confirmation of DTS access, and a brief description of the nominee's job duties and responsibilities. No special format or form is required for nominations, but please ensure all requested information is included in your submission. Selections will be made on or before 11 March 2016.
